Prof. Oxley teaches international management and strategy, and focuses her research on the organization and performance of international strategic alliances and joint ventures. She is particularly interested in how technology shapes firms' collaborative strategies, and how international differences in economic and institutional environments affect firm strategy and performance. A prolific researcher, Prof. Oxley regularly publishes in leading academic journals and serves on several editorial boards. She is a divisional executive committee member of the Academy of Management, the oldest and largest scholarly management association in the world. Prof. Oxley came to the Rotman School in 2004 from the University of Michigan, where she was nominated for a teaching award for four successive years.
