#### **Applications**

Applicants to the Police Leadership Program must submit a Nomination and Reference Form signed by their Nominating Authority, signed letter of reference, current résumé and a deposit of \$500 (\$Cdn) (cheque or money order payable to the University of Toronto). Applicants are strongly encouraged to submit their completed applications as early as possible, as they will be evaluated on a continuous basis in the order of their receipt. Class size is limited. Once the class is filled, names of eligible candidates will be put on a waiting list for the next available space or class.

#### **Program Dates**

The Spring 2006 Program will run from Monday March 20, 2006 to Saturday April 8, 2006.

#### **Computer Requirements**

All participants are required to bring a laptop/portable computer equipped to run current applications of Microsoft Office (Word, Excel, PowerPoint) and with connectivity to the Internet. Some training tutorials have been incorporated into the Program.

#### **Curriculum and Schedule**

Classes are held six days a week during a three-week period. The course days include classroom instruction, team-based learning and projects, self-directed assignments and presentations and dialogue with representatives from the enforcement, government and public sectors.

The daily program begins at 7:45 am and typically ends with an after dinner speaker. During each course day, time is allocated for fitness, individual reading and group work. A wellness and lifestyle component is included.
